

Coronavirus Restrictions

The PCC met on Tuesday and considered the current circumstances concerning coronavirus restrictions. The Church of England has devolved to parishes the responsibility to determine their response to the removal of the legal requirements that had been in place to combat the spread of the coronavirus in all its variant forms. On a day when a further 96 deaths due to Covid were announced, the PCC was reluctant to propose the abandonment of our current practices. Instead, it was agreed to ask the Standing Committee, which is to meet this coming week, to consider all available information, together with any views expressed by members of the congregation, before making recommendations about the way forward.

The Bishop of Carlisle has recommended caution in making decisions about a return to 'normal' while infection rates are still rising and many groups and individual remain unvaccinated. Hence, there is no intention to return to a physical sharing of the Peace, nor of reintroducing the common cup for Holy Communion. We also need to consider and plan for specific activities, such as the return of congregational singing, together with the need for social distancing and the wearing of face coverings. The sharing of common resources (hymnbooks, for example), the opening of the church throughout the week, recommencing the serving of refreshments after services, regular services of Evensong - there is a lot to consider and plan for in the weeks and months ahead.

Consequently, for the present, all our existing arrangements remain in place. We are sure you will agree that we need to show caution before making changes to the protocols that have helped to keep us all safe during the past year. Please be assured that we will consider all advice and recommendations and we ask for your continuing patience as we work to devise the best way forward.

There is no doubt that the singing of much loved hymns is an important part of our worship, adding atmosphere and meaning to our celebration. However, it is accepted that the spread of coronavirus is primarily caused by aerosol dispersion of water droplets. If you have any views about the resumption of congregational singing that you would like us to consider, please speak to Andrew, one of the churchwardens or any member of the PCC after this morning's service or contact one of us by e-mail before Wednesday. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
