A very warm welcome to our service this morning.

Please be aware of the arrangements we have in place to keep everyone safe and follow the directions and guidance of the stewards. The information below explains the current situation.

Coronavirus Restrictions

As we said last week, the Church of England has devolved to parishes the responsibility to determine their response to the removal of the legal requirements that have been in place to combat the spread of the coronavirus in all its variant forms. The decisions of the Standing Committee, endorsed by the PCC, which we announced last week still apply as we continue our considered and gradual return to normality. There is copy of the revised Guidelines for Public Worship accompanying this pewsheet for you to take away with you. The most important guidelines remain:

Please continue to use the hand sanitiser when you enter and before you leave the building; wear a face covering whilst in church; and maintain social distancing.

Apart from the coronavirus, there are lots of other viruses and infections in circulation and it makes sense to do all we can to prevent cross-infection. To this end, we have decided to stick with our existing seating arrangements. If you wish to sit with friends in church and meet with them after the service that is your right, but we ask that you consider the needs of the whole congregation and do your best to maintain social distancing. The arrangements for the distribution of the host will also be unchanged.

Until the 16th August, we are legally required to continue to record contact details of those attending services and this we shall do.

The Government imposed restrictions regarding the number of singers permitted have been removed and this morning we are able to have an expanded choir. Also today we are introducing a limited form of congregational singing. You will have found in your pew this morning a hymn book (which has been carefully cleaned and sanitised) so that you can follow the hymns being sung by the choir and even join them if you wish to do so. However, we ask that you **remain seated and retain your face covering** whilst so doing. It is recognised that the major cause of the spreading of infection is aerosol transmission and we must be careful as we relax the measures that have kept us safe during the past 18 months.

We will continue to monitor the situation both locally and nationally (we have already scheduled a review meeting for the first week in September) with a view to continuing a gradual return to what most of us would consider 'normality'. Again, thank you for your continuing understanding and support.

Baptism

We pray for Liam James Edward Davies who is to be baptised here today. We pray too for his parents Jane and William, his sister Esme and all those who will gather to support him. Jane and William were married in this church in 2013 and Esme baptised in 2018. The service will begin at 1.00 pm.

The disruption of their examination preparation and the confusion over the assessment process has caused much stress for them all. We ask for the peace and comfort of God's presence in their lives as they prepare to enter the next stage of their education and development.
