## What did you do in the Jubilee?

The present generations are exceptional in the fact that they have had the opportunity to celebrate and enjoy up to five royal Jubilees, those of more mature years, remembering the Silver Jubilee of King George V in 1935. Queen Victoria, of course, celebrated three such events, but our present Queen is the first British monarch to sit on the throne for seventy years.

The word 'Jubilee' means a special anniversary and is of biblical origin. It is referred to in the Hebrew Bible as a year of restoration and emancipation, usually after fifty years. In the Catholic Church, the word referred to remission from prison under certain conditions, granted for a year, after twenty five years. 'Jubilate Deo' or 'rejoice in God' is an Anglican canticle based on Psalm 100.

However, the English word seems to be derived from old French 'jubile' from late Latin 'jubilaus (annus)' 'year of the jubilee' based on the Hebrew word 'yobel', a ram's horn trumpet used to announce the Jubilee Year. The word is now associated with celebrating the decades of the Monarch's reign.

No doubt, we all have memories of the Jubilee celebrations in which we have been a part. In the 1977 Silver Jubilee, as a member of our local Church 'Young Wives' group, I remember country dancing through the village in red, white and blue skirts made by one of our members, then in Newmarket, taking on the role of Anne of Cleves with Henry VIII and his other wives, in a pageant depicting the lives of all the previous monarchs.

The Golden Jubilee of 2002 in Beetham found us enjoying the 'Jubilee Picnic' at Dallam Tower at the invitation of the Brigadier and Mrs. Tryon Wilson and then a Beacon fire and fireworks at Beetham Hall.

The Diamond Jubilee of 2012 was recognised on Shrove Tuesday just after the anniversary of the Accession. The thespians of Beetham Church led by Canon Sandy Lofthouse, provided the entertainment at the Shrove Tuesday Supper in the Heron Corn Mill Barn in 1952 style, 'on the wireless!' Guests were treated to 'Listen with Mother', 'Flanders and Swan', 'The Goon Show', 'Take It From Here' and many other programmes to tickle and amuse. In May, 'Her Majesty, the Queen and Prince Philip' accompanied by their entourage and the Band of Beetham Primary School pupils, processed to the Church for a Jubilee service in weather reminiscent of the Coronation day in 1953.

What treats are in store for the Platinum Jubilee? The Annual Church Flower Weekend will depict the decades of the Queen's reign with flowers, music and an exhibition of Beetham life during the last seventy years, together with special Jubilee Church services. The infants at Beetham School have already painted portraits of the Queen and written to Her Majesty, who to the delight of them all, has replied with her thanks. Each of the children is busy making a souvenir plate from mod-roc to keep and to mark this special Platinum Jubilee Year.

Whatever you do or are involved in during this Platinum Jubilee, enjoy it all and give thanks for the devotion, service and long life of her gracious Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

God Save the Queen!

## Letter from The Revd Andrew Norman

### Dear friends

Earlier in the year I wrote about the beginning of the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen, recalling that on Accession Day (6th February) Queen Elizabeth II became the first British monarch to celebrate seventy years on the throne. And, as those who have lived and are living through our country's second Elizabethan age, we are fully aware of the historical significance of such celebrations. When, in looking back on the last seven decades, we record the extraordinary (and perhaps unparalleled) progress socially, technologically and culturally that have benefited peoples across the world.

Though attitudes towards the monarchy differ and can be the cause of debate and disagreement; even the most ardent sceptic would be hard pressed not to recognise the diligent and unstinting service that Her Majesty has demonstrated throughout the last seven decades. As with hope and purpose, with faith and resolve she has sought to serve both God and through serving God do her utmost for the welfare of the people committed to her charge.

At the Coronation in June 1953, before anything else, the Queen was asked by the Archbishop of Canterbury whether she was willing to undertake all that would be asked of her. A reminder – after seventy years of service – that everything has followed came from Her Majesty's choice of all that was being asked of her. In recognising this we remember that the Queen's lifetime of dedicated duty has not been predicated on a meaningless approach to doing what was expected of her, but rather an active decision to serve, regardless of the cost that it brings.

Such attitudes and values do not always chime well with our modern era, when in an individualistic and consumerist age we forget the meaningfulness of sacrifice and what this means in life, work and community; so that those around us (and not just we ourselves) can find happiness, contentment and flourishing. In this the Queen has, in our own unique way, heeded the words Jesus offered to his first disciples about the way he was asking them to go, 'if any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.' In short, we are taught the real beauty of life, the vision that God intends for us all, in our willingness and choice to give ourselves wholeheartedly to others. To love and serve as we trust that God has already sought to love and serve us, most tangibly in the life, teachings and example of Jesus Christ.

In The Book of Common Prayer, there is set down a prayer for our Queen that was intended to be, and in many places still is, prayed daily. Though the prayer was originally written for a different time and monarch altogether, in the ferment and fervour of the English Reformation, when the political and constitutional life of our nation was more fiercely contended than today. It would be difficult to find more apposite words to frame all the celebrations that will take place across the country at the beginning of this month; as communities both locally and nationally come together, in varied ways, in thanksgiving for our Queen's steadfast devotion to duty and service, including here in our own village.

*O Lord our heavenly Father,  
high and mighty, King of kings, Lord of lords, the only Ruler of princes,  
who dost from thy throne behold all the dwellers upon earth;  
most heartily we beseech thee with thy favour  
to behold our most gracious Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth;  
and so replenish her with the grace of thy Holy Spirit,  
that she may always incline to thy will, and walk in thy way:  
endue her plenteously with heavenly gifts;  
grant her in health and wealth long to live;  
strengthen her that she may vanquish and overcome all her enemies;  
and finally, after this life, she may attain everlasting joy and felicity;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

It has been another busy month with lots of exciting things happening in school.

Our Year 6 children all sat their SATs in Maths and English. They were amazing with their positive and relaxed attitude throughout the week; really showing their maturity with the expectations of them. As a reward they were treated to marshmallows and hot chocolate around the fire pit on the field on Thursday afternoon.

All our Year 3 and 4 children took part in a rounders festival held by Dallam School. The children really enjoyed their experience and performed amazingly winning the majority of their matches - well done for your great attitudes and sportsmanship!

We continue to place a high importance on our environment and sustainability in school. This term our outdoor learning has focussed on stories in KS2. We have made story settings out of natural items as well as story stones to share with others. Key Stage 1 have been thinking about habitats and growth. We were using our observation skills to look at the different stages of the dandelions on our school field and thought about how they disperse their seeds. We also thought about the smaller creatures in our school and refurbished our 'Bug Hotel' using new pallets but recycling the old ones to create the pieces inside.

Key Stage 1 have also been learning about Baptism in RE. This included a wonderful experience of taking one of the school dolls to be Baptised at St Michael's led by Father Andrew.

Our EYFS class have welcomed some visitors this month. The children received a delivery of caterpillars which they made a habitat for and have watched over the last few weeks. These caterpillars have got bigger and bigger until they finally climbed to the top of their habitat and began to form a chrysalis. We now wait with excitement to find out the next stage of the life cycle - I wonder what that might be?!

Our big news this month though is that we have taken the Year 3 and 4 children on an amazing residential to Tower Wood. This was the first time in several years that we have been allowed to do residential so the excitement was high to say the least. All the children took part in outdoor activities including rock climbing, paddle boarding, canoeing and hill walking. It was a brilliant experience for all involved and thoroughly enjoyed.

We would like to thank everyone in the community and from further afield who supported the Duck Day and have shown support for our Jubilee celebrations. We are truly grateful for everyone's support.

This half term we will be saying a temporary goodbye to Miss McClure who will be leaving us to have her baby. We would like to thank her for all her hard work at lunch times and with playgroup and look forward to meeting the new addition.

We will also be saying goodbye to Mrs Horsman at the end of this school year. Mrs Horsman has been with the school for 9 years and has decided that it is time for new adventures. We will all miss her calm demeanour and enthusiasm she brings to our school but wish her luck with her new adventures!

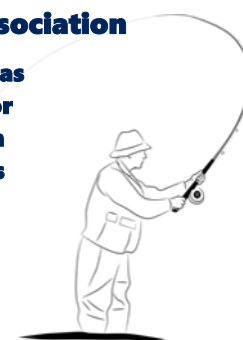

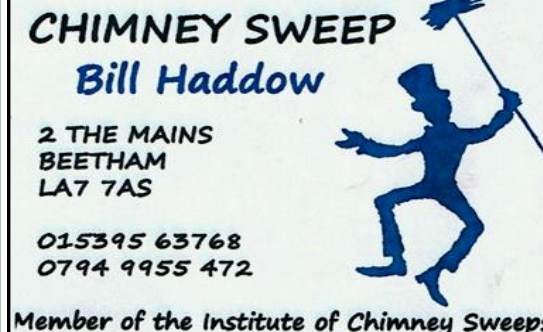

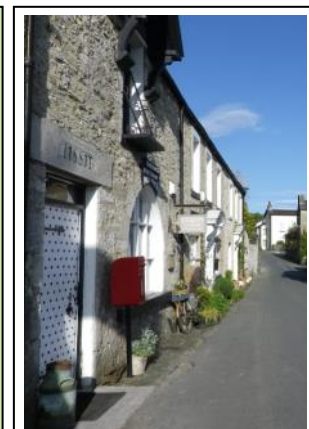
