"A bit of family news . . ."

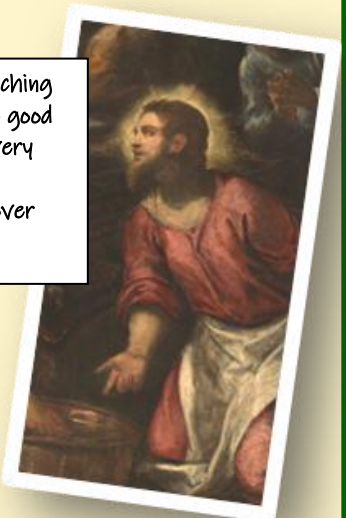

*Would you like to have a say in the running of our church?  
If so, you may be interested in becoming a churchwarden  
or member of our Parochial Church Council*

Three churchwardens are elected at the Annual Vestry  
Meeting by members of the parish in April each year, and are  
the Bishops local representatives. They are the senior lay  
people in the parish, active members of the congregation,  
and ex officio members of the PCC. Their responsibilities are  
laid down in Church Law in a role that dates back to the  
13th century, providing a rewarding opportunity to  
recognise the importance of lay participation in the life of the  
church. Churchwardens stand for election every year

**PCC members** are elected at the Annual Parochial Church  
Meeting by members of the church electoral roll. The PCC is  
collectively responsible for the care of the church and the  
finances, and members represent both the church and the  
parish at our 6 PCC meetings each year. PCC members are  
elected for a term of 3 years

## What is Lent?

In the Christian calendar, Lent is the 40 days leading up to Easter which is treated as a period of reflection and a time for fasting from food and festivities. It symbolises the days which lead up to Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection when Christ spent 40 days and nights alone in the desert.

### When does Lent start?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (the day after Shrove Tuesday) so for 2020 it is February 26th

### When does Lent end?

The liturgical end of Lent this year is Thursday April 9th, and the Lenten Fast ends on Holy Saturday

### So is Lent 40 days?

It's actually 46 calendar days but Sundays are not included as fast days

### What is Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday is seen as the day to clean the soul before Lent starts. Traditionally ashes are used to mark churchgoers on the forehead with a cross, to symbolise repentance for sin. Palm crosses from the last Palm Sunday are used to make the ashes and it is also said to be a reminder that death comes to everyone

## Epiphany to Candlemas

In the Christian calendar the period from Epiphany on 6th January to Candlemas on 2nd February is still celebrating Christmas. It is for this reason that the Nativity crib and Christmas tree are remaining in church until Candlemas.

As part of this season a candlelit Epiphany Carol Service was held on Sunday 12th January. Thank you to all the readers of the Bible readings and moving Epiphany poems, and particular thanks to Geoff Field and the choir for the lovely anthems and music throughout the poignant service

All are invited to our candlelit Choral Evensong for Candlemas. Also known as the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, Candlemas is celebrated on 2nd February and marks when Jesus was presented to God in the temple in Jerusalem 40 days after his birth, as was the custom for a Jewish boy at that time.

Originally an ancient festival marking the midpoint of winter, it was not until the 5th century that the Christian festival was observed with lighted candles and the name Candlemas adopted. The candles to be used in the church during the coming year are blessed, reminding us of Jesus as the Light of the World guiding us out of the darkness

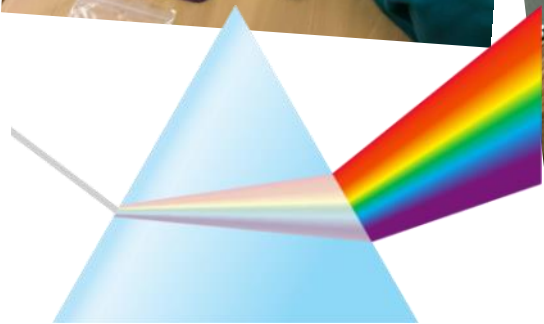
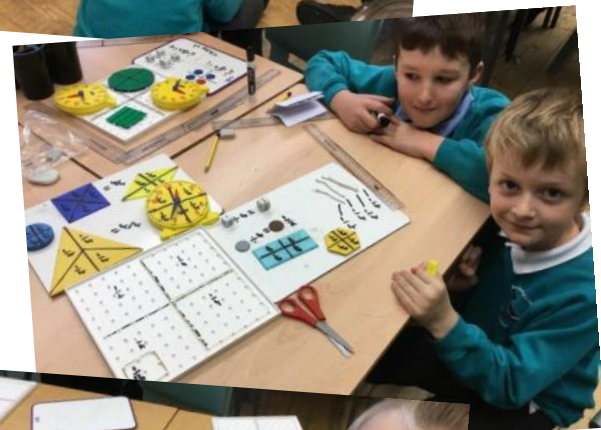

# School Corner

We have enjoyed our start back to the Spring Term even though the weather has been rather dreary!

Our term began with a celebration of Epiphany in church, led by Father Andrew. The children completed the Nativity Scene with the arrival of the Three Kings and enjoyed the wonder of the beautiful Beetham Crib.

There has been lots of exciting learning taking place in class:

- Yr 1 & 2 have been learning the skill of 'Hot Seating' in English. This is where someone takes on a character and is questioned and has to answer in role. Yr 1 & 2 have been enjoying the story of 'Burger Boy' - a young boy who loves burgers and eats nothing else. One day his mother's warning comes true and he turns into one! The children hot seated as Burger Boy and his mother and answered some very difficult questions, using their knowledge of the text.
- Yr 3 & 4 have been working hard to develop their skills with fractions, using lots of different equipment, including clocks, to help master this important area of mathematics. In Science the children have been learning about light through carrying out different experiments to see how light travels, which colours show up best in the dark and which materials are the most visible in torchlight.

We are delighted to have 5 new Nursery children who have started since Christmas. They are all settling in really well and enjoying getting to know each other and taking part in lots of fun activities in our Early Years Class.

This week all the children from Yr 1 - 6 took part in a cross country event at Dallam School. It was a very wet and cold afternoon but all the children finished their races and competed with enthusiasm. A special 'Well Done' to Holly for coming 3<sup>rd</sup> in Yr 5 girls, Morgan for 4<sup>th</sup> place in Yr 6 boys and Ben for 4<sup>th</sup> place in Yr 2 boys.

We are now looking forward to our Reading and Book Week which takes place next week. The School Council have organised different book related events to raise money for the NSPCC and staff are busy planning a timetable of exciting and interesting reading and book lessons/activities. The week finishes with the opportunity for children to dress up as their favourite book character and a visit from the Library Van.
