A NEW SEASON

To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted.....
(Ecclesiastes ch 3)

We all live to certain cyclical patterns: the pattern of each day; the seasons of the year and the church calendar which gives us the sequence of liturgical seasons as a backcloth before which we live our lives. That backcloth of ever-rolling time will always run on relentlessly – we cannot control it. It is what we do in front of the backcloth that shapes our lives.

The most obvious pattern is our diurnal one: each day begins with stirring and rising, followed by activity, then restfulness, finally ending with sleep. Even nocturnal creatures follow a similar pattern – it is just their timing that differs!

The seasons of the year, similarly, echo this: Spring awakening – Summer flourishing – Autumn slowing down – and Winter hibernation.



Spring is the time of beginnings, exciting opportunities, and anticipation for the future. Seeds planted in this time will then take root and mature during Summer's labour, producing a harvest in the Autumn, a reaping of our efforts. Then everything draws to a close in Winter. Normally, we think of childhood and youth as springtime, while summer represents the emerging prime of life. Then autumn starts somewhere beyond middle age perhaps, and everything slows and fades to a finish in elderly wintertime.

My emphasis here is not talking about the concept of aging, but rather our growth, our progress, our advancement. Growing old is mandatory, growing up is optional. Each season is unique and adds important dimensions to life. Spring is about potential, promise and possibilities. It is the time of beginnings and can be invigorating.

Here we are in March - the beginning of Spring, offering brand new opportunities and possibilities; about new starts, new dawns, new ideas. At this time of year the Church calendar is in Lent, a period of reflection before the miraculous New Life that the Easter story will demonstrate next month.

Carpe Diem (Seize the Day!) is an oft-quoted motto. But we should not just seize the day, but every **moment**, every **opportunity**, every **thought**, every **sentiment**.

Or, in stark and simple terms: enjoy what you're doing, where you're doing it, and make the most of every experience!

Three churchwardens are elected at the Annual Vestry Meeting by members of the parish in April each year, and are the Bishops local representatives. They are the senior lay people in the parish, active members of the congregation, and ex officio members of the PCC. Churchwardens stand for election every year and generally serve for 3-6 years

**PCC members** are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting by members of the church electoral roll. The PCC is collectively responsible for the care of the church and the finances, and members represent both the church and the parish at our 6 PCC meetings each year. PCC members are elected for a term of 3 years

If you would like more information on either of these roles please speak to the churchwardens. **Nomination forms must be received by the PCC Secretary by Saturday 25th April**

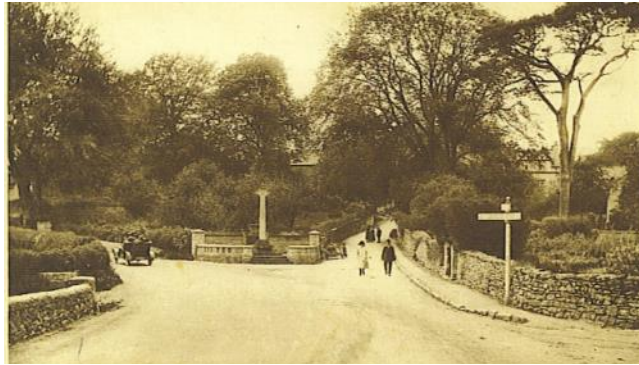
Beetham Church Electoral Roll 2020

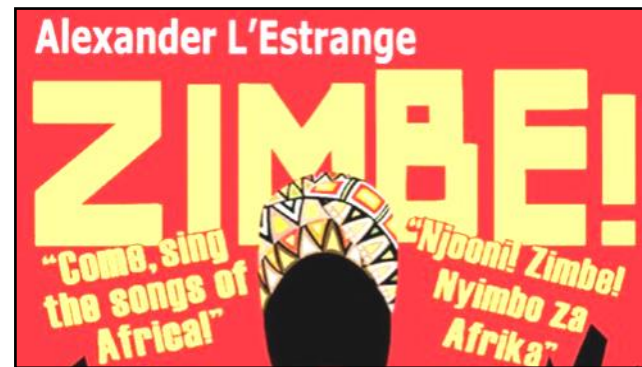

School Corner

We have just returned from our half term holiday which we were all very ready for after a wet and windy 6 weeks at school!

The week before the holiday we had a 'Reading Week' at school. This began with a workshop for parents, explaining how we teach reading at school and offering support and strategies for helping children to read at home. We also visited church to share Bible stories, brought in our favourite books and enjoyed a visit from the Library Van.

The children were invited to take part in a special homework activity to make a 'Book in a Box' or a 'Wooden Spoon Book Character'. We were really pleased with the fantastic things the children produced and as you can see from the pictures they are from a wide range of stories and put together in many different ways. We now have a display of all their 'Reading Week' work around school and it looks wonderful.

During the week the School Council organised several events to raise money for the NSPCC : they ran a book stall, a book quiz, a colouring competition and a dressing up day where all the children (and the staff too) came dressed as their favourite book character.

This was a great week, which really encouraged the children to share their love of reading and books and gave the opportunity for everyone to enjoy stories together.

In PE the children have been working very hard to develop their gymnastic skills, coached by Sarah Colyer. The children learnt sequences of floor movements, body management and how to use the vault. Teams of 6 children then took part in a gym competition at Dallam School and did very well. The Yr 1 & 2 team got a bronze medal and the Yr 3 & 4 team got a silver medal, with Megan receiving an additional medal for the highest score in her age group. The Yr 3 & 4 team then went through to the next round with schools from all over the South Lakes and were the Runners- Up, receiving a super shield.

Last week we had a visit from Claire Griffel, who is the person who coordinates our twinning project with Ataba Tabar School in Senegal. She came to talk with the children about her recent visit to Senegal and to give us all the very good news that the school roof has been

repaired with the help of the money we raised. I received the following email from the headteacher, Mamadou Balde, thanking us for our help:

'Thank you dear colleague Wendy. Thank you to all the Beetham Students. Their twins from Ataba Tabar thank them indefinitely for their help. Indeed the roof was completely restored and the students were very happy to enter a room where the roof is new. Thanks again, Mamadou.'

Yesterday we visited church on Ash Wednesday. Father Andrew led us in worship, talking with the children about the meaning of Shrove Tuesday, Ash Wednesday and Lent. The children chose whether they would like to be marked with the sign of the cross in ash, before our worship ended with prayers and a song about praying for peace.

This half term at school is very busy for us with STEM week, a dance performance at the Brewery in Kendal, a hockey tournament and lots of exiting learning and play in the weeks leading to Easter.
