



## LINDA'S LETTER

## **APRIL 2015**

The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you" Matthew 28: 5-7

In the last few weeks walking round the parish and on the country tracks in and around Beetham, I've been truly amazed by the fresh spring colours: the bright vivid greens, the pink and white blossoms, the yellow of the daffodils. We are so very fortunate here in the northern hemisphere that our seasons work so perfectly with the church's calendar, especially when it comes to Easter. The earth is bursting forth with life; while the light is pushing back the winter darkness. We can endure almost anything so long as we know or believe it will not last forever. So we can face the rigours of the winter because we know that spring will eventually come.

What all this underlines is the importance of hope. Hope is as necessary for the human spirit as bread is for the body. And Easter provides us with that reason to hope. The world did not take much notice on that first resurrection day. The reason for this lies in the fact that it was such a humble and hidden event. Jesus didn't appear in triumph in the Temple in Jerusalem, humiliating those who had humiliated him. Only those whom he called by name, with whom he broke bread and to whom he spoke words of peace were aware of what had really happened that day. And even they had difficulty in believing; like us, they were slow to catch on – running away in terror or amazement. Yet, it was this hidden event that freed humanity from the shackles of death. Jesus rose as a sign that God's love is stronger than death.

The resurrection of Jesus cannot be separated from the resurrection of humanity. At Easter we still feel the pain of those we have loved and lost, perhaps we are aware of pains within our own families, or among our friends, or pain within our own hearts. But we can face the future with renewed hope in our lives – it doesn't remove the loss but hopefully it helps to give it meaning. All is different because Jesus is alive and speaks his words of peace to us, as he spoke them to those first disciples. Faith in the resurrection of Jesus is the basis of our hope in eternal life and it is this hope that enables us to overcome the trials and tribulations of this mortal life. Therefore there is quiet joy among us and a deep sense of peace and gratitude because we know that life is stronger than death, love is stronger than fear, and hope is stronger than despair.

Several years ago I heard a story of a woman who said that her great-grandson asked why she had so many wrinkles on her hands. "I'm old," she told him. "Do you know what happens when you get old," the child asked, "You die and they bury you in the ground." Before she could say anything he added, "But that's ok; because God comes along and he unburies you". What more is there to say? He's just told the entire Easter story in one sentence. It's that simple. We get buried by the circumstances of life and God comes along and unburies us. Over and over again God comes to the tombs of our lives and unburies us. That is Easter. That is the power and love of God. It is as true as it is simple.



## Called to Serve

## Have you ever thought about being a Reader?

All sorts of different people are called to Reader Ministry - in their twenties, in their fifties, workers, retired, single, busy parents...

## What are Readers (Licensed Lay Ministers)?

Readers are lay people who have been trained for ministry and licensed by their Bishop. Readers are called to preach and lead services. Most people who explore Reader Ministry will be strongly encouraged to start by doing the 'Called to Serve' course. Following the Diocesan selection process, academic training will normally be spread over two years. It includes learning about the Bible and what Christians believe, as well as skills for ministerial practice, and also includes a placement in another church. After completing your training you will be licensed for ministry at the discretion of the Bishop.

## What are Local Lay Ministers?

A Local Lay Minister has a specific role, which depends on their gifts and the needs of the parish. It generally involves leadership responsibility for some aspect of the church's work - perhaps pastoral, organisational or mission-focussed. Practical training is given over 4 years, and commissioning by the Bishop to exercise a particular ministry within the parish can take place at any point in this period

## Services for Holy Week

## Sunday 29th March, 10am ~ Procession of Palms & Eucharist

Palm Sunday commemorates the day Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey, in the week before his crucifixion, followed by a large crowd carrying palm branches and hailing him as the Messiah

Monday 30th March, 9.30am ~ Holy Communion Tuesday 31st March, 9.30am ~ Holy Communion Wednesday 1st April, 9.30am ~ Holy Communion Maundy Thursday, 7pm ~ Eucharist, foot washing & stripping of the altar

Maundy Thursday recalls the Last Supper. The name Maundy was derived from the words of Jesus "Mandatum novum" ('a new commandment') recorded by John at the supper. Mandatum has become associated with the ceremony of foot washing in memory of Jesus washing his disciples feet on this night. The altar is stripped at the end of the service in symbolism of Jesus being stripped by the Roman soldiers prior to His crucifixion

## Good Friday, 2pm ~ Hour at the Cross

Good Friday is a reminder of the pain of Christ's crucifixion. The origin of the name 'Good' is unknown, but is thought to have either derived from the old English 'God's Friday' when Good actually meant Holy, or because the suffering of Jesus marked the beginning of the good news of deliverance

## Holy Saturday, 7pm ~ Vigil with renewal of baptismal vows

The Holy Saturday Vigil commemorates the day of meditation and prayer when Christ's disciples were awaiting His resurrection. The service is held in the evening to mark the first celebration of Easter, as days originally began at sunset, and includes the lighting of the Easter (Paschal) candle and the renewal of baptismal vows by the congregation

## Easter Morning, 10am ~ Easter Eucharist

Easter Sunday celebrates the day that Jesus came back to life three days after his death on the cross, and is also known as Resurrection Sunday.


Easter Sunday marks the end of Lent. Eggs are traditionally given because they are associated with a new beginning when a chick hatches from the egg, and they are now a symbol that Jesus rose from the dead on this day

## Bygone Beetham - Beetham Bridge



This view of the bridge over the River Bela at Beetham is from 1912, showing that ducks have been racing on the river for over 100 years!

An earlier 7-arch bridge spanned the Bela to the east of Beetham House, and the main turnpike road passed between the house and a shallow lake in the river. The old bridge was demolished and a new 3-arch bridge was completed to the west of Beetham House in 1822, but the lake remained until the mid-twentieth century

The River Bela was also known as the Betha from which the name Beetham is derived. It flows from a source near Overthwaite to the Kent Estuary at Milnthorpe. The Bela divides round an island below Beetham Bridge, and the fast flowing water over the weir constructed at Bela Falls below the island once powered the old paper mill (now Billerud). It still continues to provide power for Heron Corn Mill today







## BEETHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER ISSUE No 22, JANUARY - MARCH 2015

The Parish Council's project for improving the small plot of land beside the A5282 at Dixies, Sandside, is progressing and is expected to be completed in 2015. Additional sources of funding for the project are being explored along with possibilities for a more ambitious overall plan. You will be kept informed as this develops. Similarly, tree management work in Sandside Cutting is proceeding well now we seem to be just about through the winter season. The small boulders placed at Dixies to prevent unwanted car parking have, so far achieved this objective. Those placed in the A6 layby at Beetham and along Hale Green have generally been successful, despite attempts by some determined motorists to move them. Finally, on this general subject, issues to improve road safety in Mill Lane, Beetham, remain as yet unresolved, due to ownership and responsibility complications.

Under a recent initiative by SLDC, as the local planning authority, all South Lakes parish councils have been asked to identify suitable sites for development - either residential light commercial or a mixture of both. Beetham has suggested a brown-field site alongside the B5282, between The Kingfisher and The Ship, to include parts of Quarry Lane which runs parallel to it. An important proviso is the need for a short access road between the two existing roads, somewhere near the present entrances to the Travis Parkins site. An attractive and useful development could result.

On the financial front, the Parish Council budget for 2015/16 has now been set at virtually the same level as for the current vear. A substantial item in this budget is provision for the replacement of streetlamps as and when Electricity North West decides to implement its new policy of removing our lamps from its poles. Our objective is to ensure that, wherever these lamps continue to be needed, they will be provided Another financial matter is the latest central government initiative on transparency. Because small councils like ours are soon to be excused an external audit, they will be obliged to publish on a website more details of their expenditure. Fortunately Beetham already has a website and much of the required information is already there. All other required information is readily available and will appear on our website on or before the deadline of 1 April 2017. Finally, grants approved at Beetham PC's March meeting were £700 to the Arnside & Silverdale AONB and £60 to the Royal British Legion (for poppy wreaths).

By the time you receive this Newsletter, the resumed public hearing over the Burntbarrow Woods inquiry will have concluded, although the result still may not be known. Full details of the decision will appear in the next following Newsletter. Likewise, the parish Annual Assembly 2015 will have taken place and we shall report on its noteworthy points.

Coming up in May is the General Election and, locally, the Beetham Parish Council election. Whilst we do not yet know who our councillors for the next four years are to be, we do know that Cllr Pru Jupe will be standing down as Chair and that, if re-elected, Cllr Brian Meakin has agreed to take over that role. If you are not already a councillor and would like to stand, we would encourage you to do so. Meanwhile, it is reassuring that key social statistics show South Lakes in a very favourable light compared with the rest of the country and your parish as an outstanding performer here. Police statistics paint a similar picture. Well done Beetham parish!
