It may only be the middle of November as I sit down to write this message, but everywhere there is evidence that Christmas is coming. A constant stream of television advertisements daily recommend what we need to do, and what we need to buy, in order to ensure for ourselves and for those whom we love the cheeriest and merriest of Christmases. Meanwhile, on the high street, Christmas lights are already in place and shop windows sport Christmas trees and festive decorations in an attempt to get us open our wallets and shop early. And then there is so-called Black Friday the last Friday in November - an import from the USA where, on the Friday after Thanksgiving, - always the last Thursday in November shops and stores traditionally offer cut-price bargains. Now shops here in the UK are following suit, offering supposedly significant discounts for one day or a few days only, in order to try to create a frenzy of pre-Christmas buying.

This year, as every year, this early marketing of Christmas also has, thank goodness, an amusing side. Christmas toilet rolls with pictures of Father Christmas, reindeer, stars and Christmas trees printed on them are on sale in some local shops at £3.95 each of three for £10. An original and useful Christmas present for those for whom buying a gift is something of a challenge! And a national chain of bakery stores has caused a furore among pious-minded people by creating an advertisement showing the Three Kings worshipping a sausage-roll in a manger!

Yes, it's all happening and the razzamatazz will continue to grow and grow over the coming days and weeks. And with that, the usual panic will set in. What can we buy for Auntie Flo? Do we have to put up with Grandma again on Christmas Day? Whose turn is it to cook Christmas Dinner this year? How am I going to dress the Christmas tree, buy and wrap all the presents, make Christmas cakes and Christmas puddings and provide a cartload of mince pies in case anyone happens to pop by for a cup of coffee or tea? Tempers will get frayed, doors will be slammed, the children and grandchildren will get over-excited and fractious and the cry will go up, 'Why on earth do we bother?'



Perhaps, therefore, as we all inevitably become embroiled in the madness which is the run-up to Christmas, we should try to capture something of the quiet and stillness of the Christ-child in the Bethlehem manger. And that we can perhaps seek to do by quite simply setting aside a little time each day over the coming few weeks - it need be no more than ten minutes - to sit quietly doing nothing. Yes, NOTHING! By doing that, we might, for a short time at least, let the stresses and strains of Christmas fall away from us and experience, albeit momentarily, something of the true gift of Christmas which is 'the peace of God which passes all understanding.' Give it a try.



Origin of the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols

The original service was created in 1880 by Edward Benson, who was then Bishop of Truro. The Service took place at 10pm on Christmas Eve in a wooden building that was being used as a temporary Cathedral whilst Truro



Cathedral was being rebuilt. As he recalled when he later became the Archbishop of Canterbury "My father arranged from ancient sources a little service for Christmas Eve - nine carols and nine tiny lessons, which were read by various officers of the Church, beginning with a chorister, and ending, through the different grades, with the Bishop"

The service was adopted at other churches, but it was when the choir from King's College, Cambridge, sang their first Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols on Christmas Eve in 1918 to celebrate the end of the First World War - that the popularity grew across the UK and the world. King's College revised the Order of Service in 1919, to begin with 'Once in royal David's city' and a rearrangement of the lessons that told the Christmas story, and it has remained largely unchanged since then

The first BBC broadcast service from King's was in 1928 and has continued every year, except 1930, as a well-loved Christmas tradition. The opening verse is sung by a single young chorister - a number of choristers train, but the treble that sings it is only told just before the service

At Beetham Church the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols is held as a candlelit service on the Sunday before Christmas Eve, sung by an augmented choir for the occasion. The whole community is warmly welcome to join us on this very special occasion on 17th December



What is a Christingle?






Heron Corn Mill Older Peoples Christmas Lunch Tuesday 12th December, 1pm for 1.30pm
