#### LINDA'S LETTER

#### FEBRUARY 2015

The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them. Isaiah 11.6

This year among the many Christmas cards we received was one depicting the Edward Hicks painting titled 'The Peaceable Kingdom'. In 1812 Hicks – a Quaker minister – set off across the Pennsylvania countryside preaching in different churches. To finance his ministry, Hicks took to commercial painting: advertisements on the sides of barns and carriages and the like. But then he started painting scenes from the book of Isaiah chapter 65 – a vision often referred to as The Peaceable Kingdom. Hicks imagined a time when all human beings and wild beasts would lie down together in peace – and in the centre of every painting, was a little child to lead them, the figure of Christ, just as Isaiah foretold. Hicks grew frankly obsessed with the peaceable kingdom, painting canvas after canvas of this same basic motif, a total of 61 paintings in all.

The prophet Isaiah had a vision from God about what peace would look like: the end of weeping and crying; health and strength even for children and the old; houses to dwell in and vineyards rich with fruit; and best of all, the end of all forms of violence: safety and security for all. "No one will harm or destroy on my holy mountain" declares the Lord. Both Isaiah and Hick's saw peace so clearly, could imagine it in such detail, that they could literally paint it: one with his words, and the other with his brush. Yet neither man lived anything remotely resembling a peaceful life. The prophet Isaiah lived through a time of war and violence in Israel and had the job of calling his people to repentance complete with threats of fire and brimstone – not always a popular preaching message. While Hick's life was marked by challenges as well: personal difficulties, serious church fights, failed farming efforts, and serious financial troubles.

Perhaps we too have known our fair share of personal struggles, financial problems, failed endeavours, and painful relationships. Sometimes we get the distinct feeling that all is not well with the world – not yet. Sometimes we experience the world around us as anything but the ideal peaceable kingdom. And as a result we start thinking of peace as something that we will experience when the situation and the timing are right, when the stars are aligned, when our luck changes, when the weather improves. But the peace that Jesus offers all his disciples – including us! – is within us. Christ's peace is not the peace that is out there, over here, coming some day, or some time – not peace that will happen when terrorist attacks cease or the right party or politician is elected. Jesus is clear that when we look out there somewhere for our peace, we will never find it. The peace that depends on a certain situation; that depends on other people, on whether someone likes us or not; peace that depends on a certain job or a certain figure in the bank – well, that is no peace at all.

'My peace I give to you, my peace I leave with you.' (John 14: 27)

Into our painful, broken, beautiful, outrageous lives, Jesus has come to give us his very own peace. So whether you wake up tomorrow and the sun is shining or the storms are raging, whether the sky is falling or the world is exploding, or your bank account is empty, or your teenager hates you or whatever: you can still in your heart find the kingdom of peace. The kingdom of God is among us and within us, because the Prince of Peace has come into our midst.





#### Shrove Tuesday & Ash Wednesday

Shrove Tuesday commemorates the eve of Lent, marking 40 days and nights of fasting and prayers before Easter. The word Shrove comes from the Old English word, Shrive - to confess ones sins. Lent is a time of giving things up and so that no food was wasted families would have a feast on shriving Tuesday, and eat everything that wouldn't last the 40 days of Lent without going off. The need to eat up the fats gave rise to the French name Mardi Gras ('fat Tuesday'), and pancakes became associated with Shrove Tuesday as they were a dish that could use up all the eggs, fats and milk in the house

Pancake races are said to have begun in 1445. A woman had lost track of time on Shrove Tuesday, and was busy cooking pancakes when she heard the church bell calling the faithful to church. The woman raced out of her house and ran all the way to church - still holding her frying pan and wearing her apron!

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. In the Ash Wednesday service churchgoers are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. The use of ashes, made by burning palm crosses from the previous year's Palm Sunday, is a symbol of being penitent for things they have done wrong and a reminder that they all come from ashes, and to ashes they will return

## Bygone Beetham - Farleton



This view from around 1910 is of the lane behind the old Duke Inn to Farleton village. Farleton marks the eastern boundary of Beetham Church Parish and is mentioned in the Domesday Book

The inn thrived in the days of the Lancaster to Kendal turnpike road and canal, but closed over 50 years ago. It was named after the Duke of Cumberland who passed through the village in 1745, but who later famously became known as 'the Butcher' for his part in crushing the Jacobite Rebellion

In 1870-72, John Marius Wilson's 'Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales' described Farleton as:

"a township in Beetham parish, Westmoreland; on the river Beetha, near the Lancaster canal, 21/2 miles ESE of Milnthorpe, Acres: 1,175; Popn: 92; Houses: 13, A limestone eminence here, called Farleton Knot, has an appearance similar to the Rock of Gibraltar"



#### **EPIPHANY**

Out in the open on Cumbrian fells Herdwick sheep give birth to their lambs, hearing the first faltering cries under a freezing, crystal sky with Sirius the dog star, riding high.

The Son of God born in a cold stable cradled in straw with ox and ass. a human birth foretold by an angel: from the fields made dumb with fright, shepherds marvelled at the sight.

The worst time of year for a journey: wise men bringing gifts, gold for kingship, frankincense; myrrh for his embalming; riding on camels they came from afar following the bright Bethlehem star.

Just as the magi brought their offering spring will return with her treasures: bird song, blossom, fresh leaves unfurling, cold and harshness then fade away banished by the glory of Easter Day.

The Beetham Church Handbell Ringers played a selection of traditional carols as people entered the church, and an arrangement of the 16th century carol 'Gaudete' during the service





#### BEETHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER, ISSUE No 21, OCTOBER - DECEMBER 2014

You will all now be aware that the initial application by Fishwick's Funeral Services to construct a public crematorium at Beetham Hall was refused by SLDC, as recommended by the Parish Council. This was followed soon after by an amended application for the same development, for which the Parish Council again recommended refusal as its principal objections had still not been seriously addressed. SLDC also refused this amended application. Meanwhile, we understand that a separate application from another developer, to build a crematorium at an alternative site near Junction 36 of the M6, can be expected. We await this application with interest although we may not be asked to comment as the site lies just outside Beetham parish.

The Parish Council's project to improve the small plot of land at Dixies, on the B5282 at Sandside, is moving slowly forward. The initial delivery of stones has been positioned with the object of preventing vehicle access and a further delivery has been ordered to form a small sea barrier against high tides. Once that is in position, basic landscaping will be undertaken. The stones at the A6 layby at Beetham are now in place and serving to protect the grass verge from the damage caused by car-parking. However, car-parking spaces in Beetham village are limited and the roads narrow. This makes it unsuited to today's volume of traffic, so more work needs to be done to find a solution. There is news about the two Parish Council-owned plots of land in the parish. Members of the public will soon see the commencement of selective work on the many trees in Sandside Cutting. This is a necessary part of land management, done in conjunction with the AONB, and please be assured that the remaining trees will, in due course, be all the healthier and more attractive for it. The sizeable plot of land just off Leighton Beck Road, at Beetham, was acquired a couple of years ago in order to protect and preserve it against development. However, a small number of garages are sited on this land under verbal agreements with the Parish Council. Additionally the land is often used for the parking of extra cars by both the tenants and visitors. As from April 2015, it is the intention to introduce simple written agreements for the garage tenants in order to give the Parish Council more control over its use and so fulfil the objectives of protection and preservation.

Councils are about to begin the annual process of setting their budgets for the following financial year – in this case 2015/16. SLDC has again decided to pass on to parishes the full Council Tax Grant from central government and not to increase its own Council Tax rate, which is very welcome news for local taxpayers. Nonetheless the county is being obliged to make stringent expenditure cuts, which will be felt in its future services – including police presence on the streets (and at council meetings). Against this background there is a trend for more services to be run locally and your Parish Council would like to hear of any local projects you suggest it could usefully tackle. The Parish Council continues to give both financial and manpower support for the valuable work done by the Arnside & Silverdale AONB as well as co-operating with it on planning and policy matters. Similarly its own policy is to offer small grants to other local groups or organisations. Grant applications for 2014/15 will be considered at its March 2015 meeting.
