Now that January is out of the way, we can start looking forward to the rest of the year. "If winter comes can Spring be far behind?" wrote Percy Bysshe Shelley. But before we say a final 'farewell' to the first month of the year, it is useful to take stock and consider what we are leaving behind and what we are heading towards.

January always seems to be the longest month – the joy of Advent and the euphoria of Christmas are behind us; new resolutions (or more likely our failure to live up to them) have put a strain on us. 'Blue Monday' in the middle of the month highlights all the factors which combine to make us feel miserable. Altogether, good riddance, you might say!

The month does have its compensations, however. In church, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany - though for most of us really this is still a part of Christmas - which comes to an end with Candlemas. And we can look back with pleasure at a period of relaxation and change from our normal routine. The long evenings and frequent cold, wet and windy days give us the opportunity to spend time, with no feelings of guilt, doing those things which, at other times of the year, we often defer so that we can mow the lawn, paint the window frames, polish the tiles on the roof and the like. Yes, we look forward to Spring, but we also indulge in a touch of nostalgia - it's a sort of comfort food for the soul, and it helps us through the dark days and long nights (including 'Blue Monday'). And somehow, nostalgia seems less of an indulgence when the weather does not encourage or enable us to get out and about.



When we were at school (this is the nostalgia bit), a regular homework task was to learn a poem. Shelley was a favoured poet of at least one of my English teachers and I can still remember fragments of Ozymandias and Ode to the West Wind (from which the above quotation comes). Many of you reading this will probably recognise the increasing realisation I have that I can recall things I learned at school more readily than I can remember what I did last week! I used to learn esoteric facts so that I could impress my friends (or more often, my brothers and sisters) - the longest word in the English language (antidisestablishmentarianism) for instance, or the names and numbers of steam locomotives, and I can remember in detail the adventure stories of my favourite authors that I devoured in vast numbers (the flying ace, Squadron Leader James Bigglesworth, DFC, resplendent in flying helmet and goggles) still gazes down from the dust jackets of the books on my shelves.



And this January in particular will have been memorable for phenomenologists who (weather permitting) will have delighted in the 'super moon' that was observable at the end of the month (caveat: I am writing this mid-month and the weather may, by the time you read this, have prevented a sight of this rare occurrence, due on 31st January).

Looking forward, our most important task in church for the coming months, of course, is to complete the preparations for the time when we can advertise for a new priest for St Michael & All Angels. The production of our 'Parish Profile' is well in hand and this will give potential candidates a detailed picture of life in our church, our village and our community and hopefully inspire them to want to find out more about what makes Beetham so special. In the meantime, everyone is working hard to ensure that our regular cycle of services and other events continues seamlessly. Lent will soon be upon us and we shall be approaching the most important of all the seasons in the church's year.

So January is, I suggest, a pivotal month. It has led us to February and the promise of Spring to follow and it has given us the opportunity to indulge ourselves in a touch of nostalgia. Most of all, it has encouraged us to look forward with hope for the new experiences and challenges that we shall meet in the coming months.

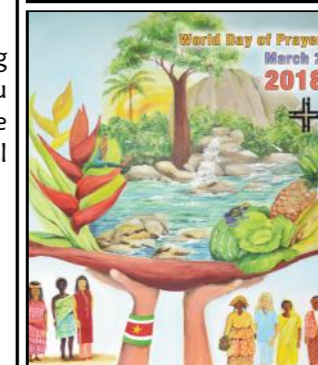


**Churchwarden and PCC vacancies**

Would you like to have a say in the running of our church?  
If so, you may be interested in becoming a churchwarden  
or member of our Parochial Church Council

Three churchwardens are elected at the Annual Vestry Meeting by members of the parish in April each year, and are the Bishops local representatives. They are the senior lay people in the parish, active members of the congregation, and ex officio members of the PCC. Their responsibilities are laid down in Church Law in a role that dates back to the 13th century, providing a rewarding opportunity to recognise the importance of lay participation in the life of the church. Churchwardens stand for election every year  
PCC members are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting by members of the church electoral roll. The PCC is collectively responsible for the care of the church and the finances, and members represent both the church and the parish at our 6 PCC meetings each year. PCC members are elected for a term of 3 years

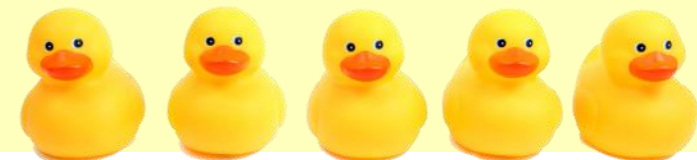

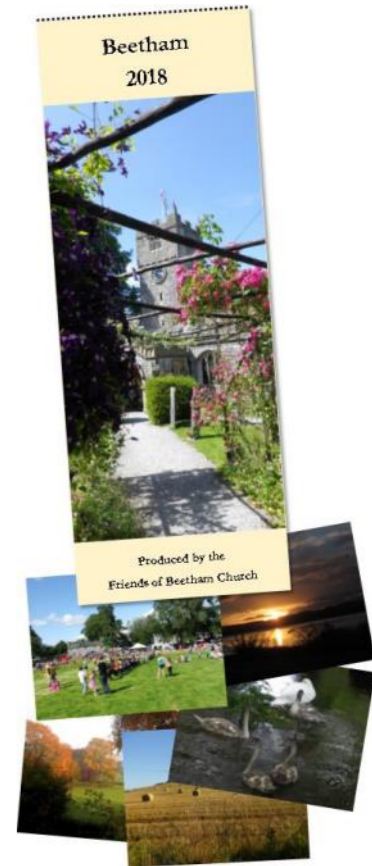

# School Corner

We are now well into the first half of our Spring Term and the children at school are working really well and taking part in lots of exciting learning activities.

Our first sporting event of this year was the Primary School Cross Country Competition organised by Dallam School. 43 children from Beetham took part, aged 6 -11, and everyone managed to complete the very muddy course. A special well done to Holly Jenner who came 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Yr 4 Girls' race.

We have recently been taking part in the Polar Explorer Project. The project has happened as a result of the £200 million government investment in a new polar research ship - the RRS Sir David Attenborough, which will enable world-leading research in Antarctica/Arctic for the next 25 years.

The Polar Explorer programme encourages and supports schools who are keen to raise aspirations and attainment in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) and aims to inspire the next generation of scientists and engineers.

We were lucky enough in December to take part in a live phone call from the Antarctic with Derren Fox, a polar explorer. Followed last week by a wonderful presentation by one of our parents Annette Ryan, who herself took part in a polar expedition.

We now have an after school 'Polar Explorer Club' who are working on building a life size albatross as one of their projects. We are all looking forward to seeing their finished sculpture and will share photos in a future edition of the Gateway.

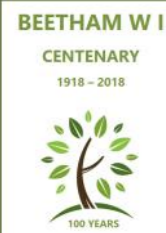
Our Christian value this half term is Generosity. We began thinking about this value during a whole school activity morning. The children learnt about the Bible story of The Widow's Mite. They then thought about how they could be generous with their things, their time and their talents. The children worked in mixed age groups to write prayers and think about other people who are generous in different ways such as mountain rescue teams, volunteer fire-fighters and first responders. We now have a lovely display about Generosity in both our entrance area and reflection space in the Beehive and the children continue to focus on this important value during our daily Worship Time.

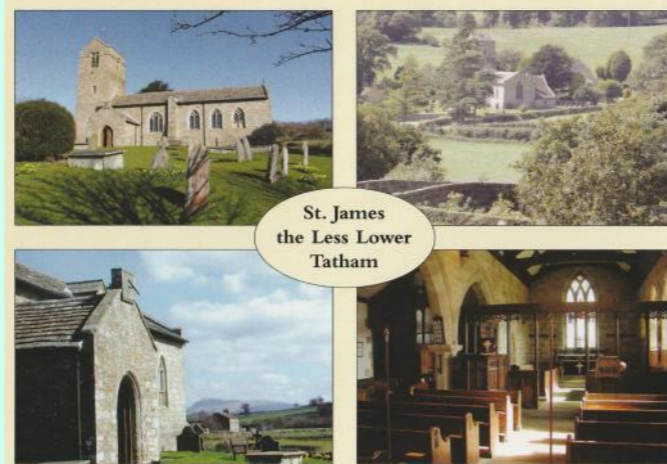

**Successful conference for Arnside & Silverdale AONB**

Arnside & Silverdale's 2018 conference was a big success, booking up within a few days of places being made available. The keynote speaker this year was Howard Davies, Chief Executive of the National Association for AONBs. He spoke about the impact of climate change on the environment, the great work being done by AONBs across the country and the Government's 25 year environment plan.



Other speakers were Bekka Corrie-Close of the Horned Beef Company, which provides beef from cows free to roam in an organic environment, eating the fresh vegetation they choose, and managing the countryside at the same time; Craig McCoy of National Trust Arnside & Silverdale who manages woodlands across the AONB, told us all about the different management techniques they use to create healthier woodlands; and the AONB's own Tony Riden who reflected on 25 years of leading the volunteering programme, which contributes over 3000 hours of important practical management work each year.

The conference finished with a Question Time style panel discussion and then workshops where attendees helped identify the key issues and priorities for the AONB landscape in the coming five years. Experts in Biodiversity, Heritage Management, Recreation and Access as well as many other areas were in attendance, and their feedback will be invaluable as the team develop their next AONB five-year Management Plan which is due to be published at the beginning of 2019 after public consultation.
