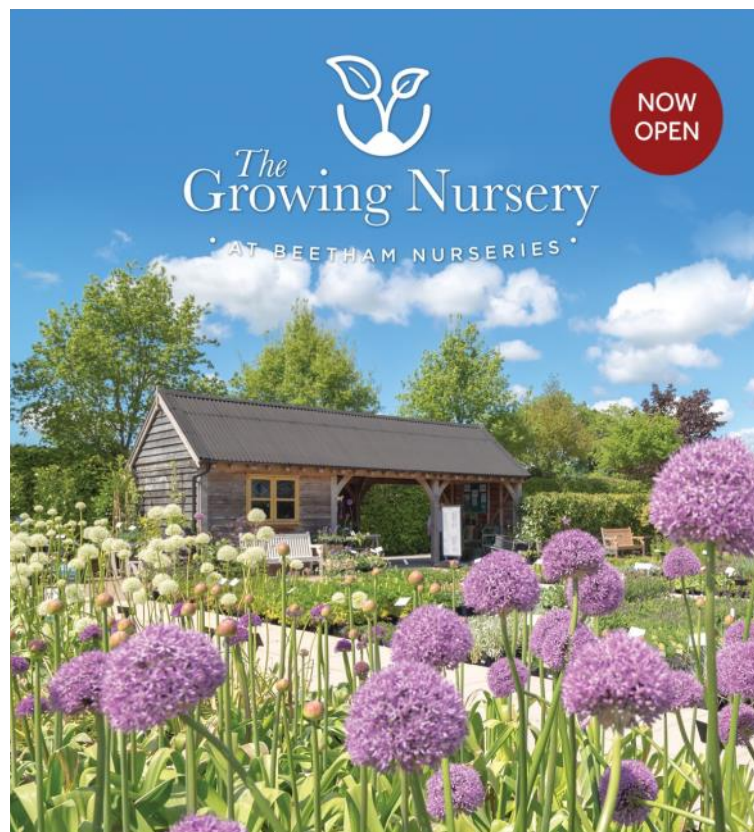

'Standing on the Shoulders of Giants'

On 21st July 1969 Neil Armstrong became the first human being to set foot on another world. Armstrong's words as he stepped down on to the surface of the moon have become the stuff of legend and the course of human history was changed forever as millions watched grainy images on their television sets or followed on the radio the relayed voices from Mission Control in Houston and from the Apollo space capsule. It was just before 3.00 am in England when Armstrong took his 'small step for [a] man'.

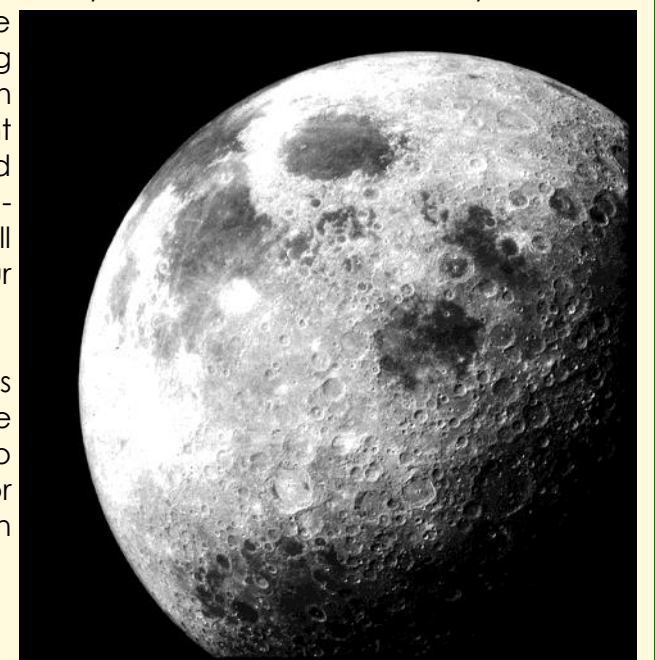
It was a historic moment and symbolic of the aspiration that has inspired men and women throughout the ages to wonder, to question, to explore and to challenge. The world we live in today would have been unthinkable for our ancestors only a few generations ago. I remember my own great grandfather (who lived to a ripe old age and thus gave me the chance to meet him) refusing to believe that a moving image on a screen was not a trick. Well, of course, it was a 'trick' but a trick brought about by advances in science and technology that he, and our common antecedents, were unable to imagine.

What is amazing, though, is that it is now 50 years - half a century - since that magnificent triumph of human ambition, courage and technology enabled Neil Armstrong's 'giant leap for mankind'. Sir Isaac Newton, in a letter to his friend and rival, Robert Hooke, in February 1676 wrote: "If I have seen further it is because I am standing on the 'sholders' (sic) of giants", modestly acknowledging that his own great achievements in mathematics and science were merely a progression from the work of others. Neil Armstrong's small step, even though it was also a 'giant leap', was made possible by thousands of other small steps made by the great thinkers and innovators of the past. Now here is a sterling question for you: where can you see on a daily basis the quotation 'Standing on the Shoulders of Giants'? *Answer on page 5*

What is the significance for us today of the events of 22nd July 1969? Well, I think it always useful to remind ourselves what mankind is capable of when we work together with a common aim. It is both humbling and uplifting to remind ourselves that progress in medicine, science and technology is often dependent on an individual human being having the curiosity and the vision to wonder, to question, to imagine, to dream - and then to experiment, to challenge and to learn. All the qualities, in fact, that we try to nurture in our children.

As we enjoy the coming months of summer, let us remember to look up at the moon from time to time and reflect on the events of that summer 50 years ago when our place in God's universe subtly changed for ever with the realisation that we are not confined in either our imagination or our world.

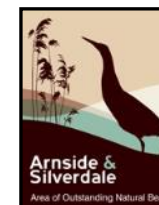

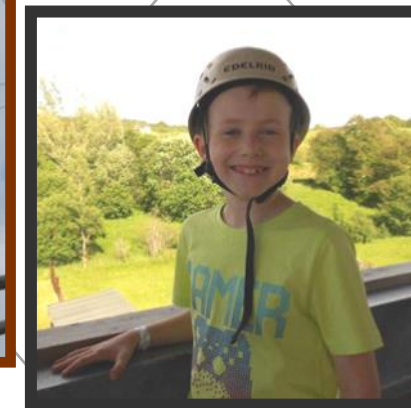
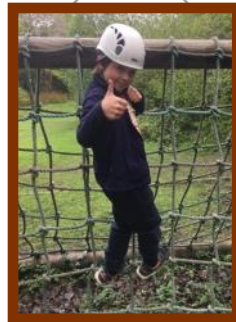

Beetham CE School Ascension Service

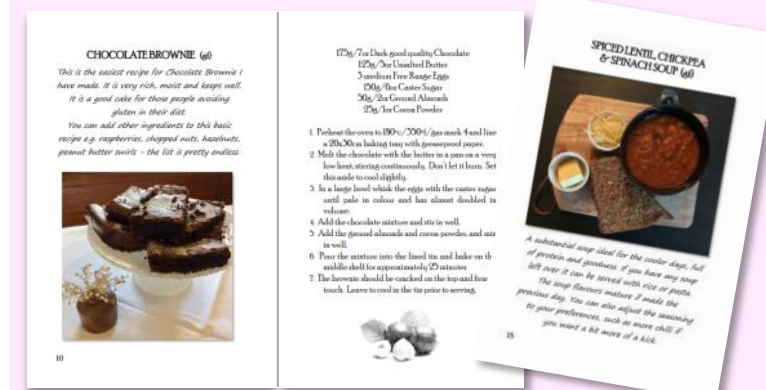

The Parish Council is delighted to report that Mrs Linda Dean, a Beetham resident, has accepted the challenge to set up and lead a Community Resilience Group. As the first step in this process, our County Council representative, Cllr P McSweeney, has asked CCC for advice on how this can best be done and we are all eagerly awaiting its response. Hopefully this whole process will be complete before winter is upon us again and we are faced with a recurrence of flooding problems. Another step to deal with emergencies is the defibrillator project. Regrettably, this is taking an inordinate amount of time to set up because we want to ensure that we provide the best equipment available and that it complies with all best practice guidelines but we really are now almost there. As an extra precaution, and from the outset, Community Heartbeat Trust will take responsibility for the Stanley Street phone kiosk, where it is to be housed, and local First Responders are all set to make use of it as and when required. Funding for the project will come from the recently received community infrastructure levy.

A shortage of car parking at Beetham crematorium continues to represent a worrying road safety issue on the A6 when two or more funerals overlap or a large number of people attend a specific cremation. Fishwicks are working with SLDC to deal with this. The longstanding water-surface problem in Leighton Beck Road is now actively being investigated by Highways, although there is no simple solution. The recent wall rebuild on the B5282 at Sandside has resulted in many criticisms from the public, with Highways citing cost as the reason why aesthetic issues had to be sacrificed; hopefully the appearance will improve with time. On the other hand, the new handrail on the path between Burntharow and Shaw Green, Storth, provided by an anonymous donor, has been warmly welcomed. Residents will also be delighted that a new bus service between Arnside and Milnthorpe has been launched by a local group and a Beetham PC member has agreed to join the steering committee of this group. Other current issues are the resurgent problem of car parking on Stanley Street, Beetham, and the poor state of repair of the Beetham stocks; action is in hand with both these things. The danger of traffic exiting Storth Road at its junction with the B5282 has long been obvious; the idea of installing a convex mirror at this location is being investigated as a possible solution.

As a result of the 2019 elections, when two long-serving Beetham PC members stood down, there are once more vacancies on the parish council – one in the east ward (Beetham/Hale/Farleton) and one in the west ward (Storth/Carr Bank). The law requires that these vacancies be filled as soon as possible. Anyone interested in being co-opted as a parish councillor for the remainder of the current four-year term should contact the Clerk – contact details above. As well as advising SLDC on local planning matters, the work of the parish council includes involvement in many other matters, as this newsletter illustrates. Little time is involved (monthly meetings) and the benefit to the community can be invaluable.
