

MOVING ON.....

The month of March, as we all know, was named by the Romans after their God of War. What a strange choice! War??? Not a happy idea! Personally, I much prefer to think of the month as the motive verb march, as in "Quick March" or "March On!".

Meteorologists tell us that March 1st is the first day of Spring. Yes, maybe, although in 2018 it brought the infamous "Beast from the East" – not in the least Spring-like! It is of course also Saint David's Day, as I well know because my mother, a Welshwoman, was so pleased when I told her of my intention to marry someone whose birthday is 1st March. Ever since then, each year without fail she sent her daughter-in-law a lovely birthday card with a picture of daffodils.





Spring – the season of new life! During this month we may see, if we're lucky, the first newborn lambs in the lowland fields around us, yet another reminder of birth into the wonder of creation. Most stark perhaps is that from the branches of trees and hedges that have for so long now appeared lifeless, new shoots of green life spring forth. And these from twigs that previously were, to all appearances, quite dead! Through parenthood or grandparenthood one may hope to see into the future, when we ourselves are no longer here. This is new life after death, perhaps?





Three churchwardens are elected at the Annual Vestry Meeting by members of the parish in April each year, and are the Bishops local representatives. They are the senior lay people in the parish, active members of the congregation, and ex officio members of the PCC. Churchwardens stand for election every year and generally serve for 3-6 years

PCC members are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting by members of the church electoral roll. The PCC is collectively responsible for the care of the church and the finances, and members represent both the church and the parish at our 6 PCC meetings each year. PCC members are elected for a term of 3 years

If you would like more information on either of these roles please speak to the churchwardens. Nomination forms must be received by the PCC Secretary by Saturday 27th April

Beetham Church Electoral Roll 2019 - 6 yearly revision

There will be a complete revision of the Church Electoral Roll this year. Names are not automatically carried forward and to join the new roll you must fill in a form and return it to the electoral roll officer, Jenny Marks, by 10th April. This enables you to vote at the APCM for members of the PCC and the Deanery Synod.

Mothering Sunday

Mothering Sunday is held on the fourth Sunday of Lent. Traditionally, Mothering Sunday was the occasion when English children who had gone to work as apprentices and domestic servants were given a day off to visit their mothers and families

Although often called Mother's Day, its origin is different from the American festival, which has been observed on the second Sunday in May since 1913. Centuries ago it was considered important for people to return to their 'mother' church at least once a year. So each year, in the middle of Lent, everyone would visit their home church, with working children being given the day off to join their family. Mothering Sunday was also called Refreshment Sunday, because the fasting rules for Lent were relaxed that day

By the 19th century, the holiday was dying out. Its revival was brought about through the influence of the American servicemen stationed here during WWII. They often regarded their English hostess as a kind of foster-mother and each year on the second Sunday in May they did what they would have done for their own

mothers - gave her flowers to thank her for her kindness and care. After the Americans had left at the end of the war the practice continued in this country, but reverting back to marking it in Lent

Beetham Church Annual Flower Festival 25th - 27th May

Each year we hold a themed Flower Festival weekend in the church at the end of May. The church is filled with lovely flower arrangements, and accompanied by an exhibition in the Lady Chapel.

Our theme this year will be 'Songs from the Musicals' to celebrate our thriving music tradition here in Beetham. Entrance is free all weekend, and the church will be full of displays - with each flower arranger making their own interpretation of the theme. The accompanying exhibition will recall the popularity and influence of 100 years of West 1 End and Broadway Musicals - from Cole Porter's 'Hitchy-Koo' and Gershwin's 'La La Lucille' in 1919, right up to the present day. Refreshments will be available, plus live 🗽 music from the Beetham Band, Beetham Handbellringers, and many talented musicians from the congregation


