LINDA'S LETTER

MAY 2017

"O all ye things that grow in the earth, bless ye the Lord: praise and exalt him above all for ever. O ye mountains, bless ye the Lord: Praise and exalt him above all for ever. O ye seas and rivers, bless ye the Lord: praise and exalt him above all for ever. O ye whales, and all that move in the waters, bless ye the Lord: praise and exalt him above all for ever. O all ye beasts and cattle, bless ye the Lord: praise and exalt him above all for ever. O ye children of men, bless ye the Lord: praise and exalt him above all for ever" Benedicite - Song of Creation

For me one of the beauties of Anglican worship is that over the weeks and months you get a real sense of the rhythm and flow of the church's year, as we commemorate the saints, both lesser and greater, with the feast days and the fasts - the seasons and the changes that occur as we pray our way through the church's year. This month we keep Rogationtide; this is a time when we ask God's blessing on the lands and the seas and all those who labour to produce the bountiful food which we enjoy. Some years ago I was given a little service book, first published in 1947, called 'Country Services' which celebrated the farming year: Plough Sunday, Rogationtide, Lammastide and Harvest Thanksgiving. Sadly fewer and fewer parishes keep or ever kept Rogation Sunday; but I think we will be all the poorer if this commemoration is consigned to the past. For those taking part in a Rogation Service there's a real connection with the land - that's if you have the fortitude to go the whole round. According to the service book, it starts off in church with the processional hymn, a short address, reading and prayer, and then we set off. The first stop is at a meadow or field, there's a blessing on the field and then on the cattle:

O God, who hast given us the humble beast to share with us the burden and heat of the day: grant that we may show our gratitude to thee, who art the Giver of all life, by treating with gentleness and consideration all living creatures entrusted to our care. May God bless your cattle, your sheep, and your horses. May he preserve them from disease, and keep them in good condition. May God bless these pastures and meadows, all growing grass, and green fields. May they remain healthy and unspoiled, and be devoted always to the service of man and beast.

The procession moves on, singing. The next stop is for the blessing of the **well, stream or river**.

The blessing of Almighty God be on these and all waters: springs and brooks, lakes and wells, small and great rivers, and the great outer oceans: blessings on all ships and sailors, on merchant seamen and fishermen, and on the whole brotherhood of the sea: God's blessing be with you all, to lead you peaceably by still waters.

We're off again following the same format: scripture, blessing, processional hymn. Our next stop is for the blessing of the crops, then on to the **farmyard** where we offer up our thanks to God as we acknowledge:

The chief thing for life is water, and bread, and a garment, and a house. Health and good constitution are better than all gold: and there is no gladness above the joy of the heart. Thanks be to God, for the simple, honest, and clean things of life: For the stirring of all young life throughout the countryside: For hard work in the open that wearies and satisfies a man: For the security of a house to come back to, with a roof over our head, a fire in our kitchens, food to eat, and sound sleep at night. Bless this house and farm, and those who live here and do their work. Give them health and purity, strength and humility, goodness and meekness. May God preserve your going out and your coming in: from this time forth and for evermore.

Now we move on to the **gardens, allotments or orchards**, hopefully coming full circle till we are **back in the churchyard**, where we offer this prayer:

Herein is a true saying, One soweth and another reapeth. Remember Lord, those who have brought us into this world...those who have borne with us...those before us who planned the fields, and marked out the farms, and trod the roads and marked out the ditches; those who first lived in this village, built this church, and brought the Good News of Christianity...All those who throughout the ages have worked hard, and trusted in God. Remember O Lord, the souls of all those who have kept the faith and grant them rest in the land of the living, whence all pain and grief have fled away, and the light of thy countenance shineth forever.

After all that walking, singing, praying; the kettle goes on for a much needed brew or you all retire to the pub. But what a great service! **Rogationtide is firmly grounded in the earth** and draws our attention to the environment in which we live, God's creation and our stewardship of it; our hope for a bountiful harvest and God's presence with us throughout life and death. So at the end of our days we might pray:

May the blessing of him who blessed all, and the peace of him who maketh all things peaceful, and the mercy of him who is all merciful, and the watchful care of our God, be with you and amongst you and around you, now and for evermore. Amen
