*Yes. I remember Adlestrop -
The name, because one afternoon
Of heat the express-train drew up there
Unwontedly. It was late June.
Edward Thomas, 'Adlestrop'*

How many of us remember the poem 'Adlestrop' from our school days? It was written by Edward Thomas after the steam train that was carrying him to visit the poet Robert Frost made an unscheduled stop at the sleepy station of Adlestrop in Gloucestershire. The train journey was in June 1914, a month before the start of the Great War, but it was not until the following year that Thomas began working on the famous verses, encouraged by his friend Frost. Sadly he never saw it in print, as he was killed on the first day of the Battle of Arras in April 1917 just 3 weeks before 'Adlestrop' was published. Adlestrop station itself was demolished as a result of the Beeching railway cuts in the 1960's.

Edward Thomas is one of the sixteen war poets commemorated on a slate stone in Westminster Abbey, also including Wilfred Owen, who composed most of his poems in the short space of a year before he too was killed in action in November 1918, only one week before the Armistice. But it is each year on Remembrance Sunday that we hear the immortal words of another of the Abbey war poets, Laurence Binyon, taken from the poem 'For the Fallen'. Written only a couple of months after Edward Thomas' train stopped at Adlestrop, the two poems convey the total contrast between the tranquillity of an English peacetime countryside and descending into the horrors of war within the space of a few weeks.

During our Act of Remembrance at the Beetham War Memorial on Sunday 10th November we will hear the Roll of Honour of the Beetham fallen from WW1 and WW2. The same will be happening in towns and villages all over the country, and overseas. It is a constant reminder that the statistics of the millions of military and civilian lives that have been lost in conflicts over the years are made up of named individuals who left others behind to mourn them and to remember them.

We will continue to remember that they died wanting to return our country to peace and to make the world a better place to live in, in the hope that their legacy will always remind us that we too each have our part to play in protecting the future of our planet

Remembrance Sunday, 10th November

The installation of the transparent silhouettes of seated figures will again take place in Beetham Church for Remembrance Sunday on 10th November. The figures were displayed last year to commemorate the centenary of the WW1 Armistice and this year are a reminder of the 75th anniversary of the D-Day landings.

Remembrance Sunday will begin with a short service at the Beetham War Memorial at 10.45am, with the Beetham Roll of Honour, laying of wreaths, sounding of the Last Post, and ringing of half-muffled bells.

First Sunday of Advent

Advent marks the period of preparation for celebration of the birth of Jesus. There are no flowers decorating the church during Advent except the Advent Wreath, a circle of evergreen plants representing God with no beginning or end.

There are four candles around the wreath, one for each Sunday in Advent, and a fifth candle for Christmas day. The candle that is lit on the First Sunday of Advent is purple and is known as the candle of Prophecy or Hope.

On the following Sundays, two further purple candles will be lit, representing Peace and Love, and the rose coloured candle of Joy, also known as the Gaudete candle. The central white candle is the Christ candle - symbolising that
