



Dear friends,

The welcome that I received upon my arrival (and that I continue to receive now) from neighbours, church and the wider community has been truly humbling and a good mark of the hospitality and generosity that I believe God asks us to demonstrate in our daily lives, so that others might know and experience the love he has shown us in the face of Jesus Christ.

At the heart then of the Church's life should be seeking after the flourishing of all in our community and that the work and witness of St Michael and All Angels should be good news for the people and parish of Beetham. I hope and pray this flourishing and transformation will be seen here in the coming months and years as together we work for the good of all, remembering in all things that God is interested in every part of human life and endeavour.

As such, in this first letter for The Gateway I want to reflect upon two things:


Firstly, to offer my sincere thanks to the contributions small or great that each and every person makes to the life of this parish and community – through your prayers, your service, your generosity and your faithfulness. It has been and continues to be greatly appreciated. At my Licensing we heard read Chapter 12 of St Paul's Letter to the Romans where we are reminded that the Church, as the body of Christ here on earth, is made up of many members; so that even though we don't all have the same function, each of us is important for the building up of each other. This is a prayer that I hope will frame this new season here in Beetham, that together we will remember our common calling in Christ to be members of his body; to support one another and seek new ways in which we can draw others into fellowship of the God whose love in Jesus is constant and unwavering.

Secondly, I also want my arrival here as your parish priest to be a challenge to each and every one of us, acting as an opportunity to examine how we respond to the changes and joys that will lie ahead. As Bishop James preached at my Licensing, to be obedient to the words of Jesus means that life will involve change, and so each of us has to be ready to examine what we already do for the Lord and be found willing to be called to do the new things that he may ask of us. Again, this depends on us having the assurance that together we are members of the same body, so that each of us knows that we can always do more together than we can do individually. Since, to follow in the way of Jesus Christ means reorienting our life in response to the grace, mercy and love we know that God has for us and for all people. A way of life that doesn't simply seek to establish our own good and welfare but more beautifully the flourishing of all, where all in our community can be nurtured and encouraged to fulfil their God-given potential.

Let us pray that that will be the case here in the parish of Beetham as this next chapter in the Christian ministry of this area begins, that together we will remember what the Lord has already wrought within us, the mission that he has entrusted to us, and that by the power and inspiration of his Holy Spirit, he will make us worthy of that calling.



Beetham Church Heritage Trust (BCHT)

Beetham Church Heritage Trust was formed in 2001 in order to provide a future safeguard of finance for the sole benefit of the fabric of the church building and grounds. The Trust can also be in a better position in emergencies to seek external contributions towards costs of replacement and repair.. It is an independent charity from the PCC, of which members cannot also be members of the Trust, although for a while this was not so and a Conflict of Interest resulted.

The initial Trustees were Rev. Ian Davies, Rosemary Tryon-Wilson, Pamela Houghton and Geoffrey Thompson. The current Trustees comprise Alan Beaumont (Chairman), Dennis Wright (Treasurer/Secretary), along with Gail Crabb, Anne Clarke and Colin Clarke.

Our regular funding comes mainly from the efforts of The Friends of Beetham Church, by way of subscriptions, and the various "efforts" which they organise. Over the past twelve months seven events have added to the coffers of BCHT. When I have expressed our gratitude to Friends committee members I have often received the reply "We only do it for the fun". That maybe the case but the fringe financial benefits are mighty useful. The PCC also gains directly from the Friends' efforts. The whole of the church community greatly benefits from the work of the Friends organisation and I take this opportunity to publicly extend our gratitude to them. Long may it continue.

Over the last academic year there have been many changes at school: We have appointed new staff, had a fantastic new classroom installed in our garden, begun to develop our new school field and increased our nursery provision to 30 hours per week. Governors have been involved in all of these changes in many different ways either using their areas of professional expertise or by providing hands on practical support. I feel very privileged to work with such a dedicated, enthusiastic and supportive group of governors and staff. Together we keep the education and happiness of the children at Beetham at the heart of everything we do and this makes our school a happy and exciting place to learn and a great place for everyone to make friends and have fun.



Viv Stirrup - Foundation Governor

I am a Licensed Lay Minister for St. Michael & All Angels and have been a Foundation Governor for Beetham Primary School for over four years. I am also the Chair of the Staffing and Curriculum Committee. Church links with the school are strong and this is an important relationship which will continue into the future. With a background in further and higher education, I find it a joy and a privilege to work alongside staff in our joint aim of maximising the fullest potential in every child.

Following a working life as a secondary schoolteacher, I have been a governor in C of E Schools for over 20 years. I am currently chair of the Community and Welfare Committee, looking to continue and develop the existing strong links between the school, church, and the wider community. My highlight of the year has to be the school's contribution to the commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the 1918 Armistice.

The Celebration Assembly held in church that week gave us the opportunity to unveil one of our 'There But Not There' figures, representing all those who had left their homes and families to answer the'ir country's call. Pupils helped to place the figure directly in front of their own commemorative display, and 'Poppy Wall', and designated that figure, 'The Beetham School Tommy'. A visit of the Royal Lancashire Fusiliers to lay a wreath at the War Memorial and gave the pupils the opportunity to talk directly to the old soldiers. The enthusiasm, knowledge and politeness of our pupils so impressed the Fusiliers that we later received a very complimentary letter of thanks from their leader. And then, on the Sunday evening, the performance of 'We Will Remember Them' by a large group of pupils during our service of 'Remembrance, Reflection and Reconciliation' crowned a glorious weekend during which the close links between the school, the church and the wider community were highlighted and strengthened.



John Lomax - Foundation Governor


