

And to Goostrey they have returned, with friends and family close at hand. The difference now is that they have yet more friends back here in Beetham who will miss them.

So let us enjoy the end of summer as the month of September reminds us of the inevitable cycles of nature that govern our lives.




Handbells and Harps!


